**Chair: Patrick Ogilvie, CPP, PSP**

- Membership increased to 646 members

- 74 employment opportunities posted in 2010 – a record year for posted opportunities
- Facilitated an RFP for a new RSVP and e-Commerce payment system built into the Chapter News/Events area.

**College Liaison: Brian Robertson, LL.B.**

- The College Liaison Committee, has grown to 7 members, and was formed this year in order to coordinate a more concerted effort to reach out to students and faculty who are involved in security-related studies at Ontario's college and universities.
- The three primary objectives are to establish and maintain good on-going contacts within the post-secondary community, to provide services to support students and faculty, and to promote the benefits of membership.
- 70 Chapter-sponsored free memberships to eligible students at 14 colleges and hosting a Student Appreciation Dinner in February at Sheridan College, Oakville Campus will be accomplished in 2011.
- Two \$500 Chapter Scholarships to deserving applicants and investigating the adding of a Security Educator of the Year Award will be accomplished.

**Best Practices Seminar: Mike Soberal, CPP and Javier Sanzsole, CPP**

- 2010 – Adjusted costing from \$125 to \$145 and eliminated early bird pricing
- Attendance was 125 registrants
- 2011 - Date set for April 21, 2011 – Venue Villa Colombo is confirmed
- First call for speakers to take place in December 2010
- Same format as last year will be followed for 2011

**Education: Tom Fulford, CPP, PSP, PCI, JD Killeen, CPP**

- 2010 CPP Study Group Winter session had 23 people in attendance. A mixture of Instructor guided and Student presentations was used for this session.
- 35 CPP Study Guide books were purchased for this group (Winter session). 23 CPP Study Guides had been issued to students, with 12 remaining held by the Chapter for future use.
- The POA Online manual was purchased for the Chapter for use by the CPP Study Groups this year
- The Fall study sessions were cancelled due to lack of response and persons that had registered were automatically put to the upcoming 2011 Winter session.
- The Winter session is to be held at Ryerson University with an information session for all three certification study groups to be held on Dec 1, 2010, also at Ryerson University.
- Additional study guides for CPP, PCI and PSP groups have already been purchased by the Chapter in anticipation of the Study Group start in Winter 2011.

**Law Enforcement & Security Practitioner: Bill Anderson, CPP**

- Overall the 2010 event was a success with consistent ratios of attendance of paying versus 'guest' attendees. This was despite having four less police agencies participate this year (110+ attendees).
- Confirmed date of October 6th, 2011 at Panamonte Banquet Hall (coordinated to avoid conflict with other industry events) with key note speaker for 2011 – Chief Glenn De Caire, Hamilton Police Service.
- 2011 Objectives:
  - Quality – Enhancing Security Practitioner submission forms & instructions & defining LE submission criteria.
  - Development of event quality and attendance through: Further Media outreach – Blue Line magazine, Security Magazine article submissions & explore ad costs.
  - Quarterly outreach activities / mailings.
